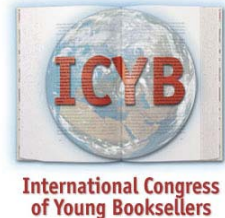


Innovate or Die

International Conference of Young Booksellers
14-15-16 June 2010 • Ghent, Belgium



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General information

Objective

The International Conference of Young Booksellers aims to offer 'young booksellers' a platform where they can exchange knowledge and participate in capacity-building workshops. The goal is to gain know-how that can be applied in their professional life. The key words for the conference are 'worthwhile' and 'exciting'.

5 workshops

There will be 5 parallel brainstorming workshops (covering 1,5 day of the conference). The goal? To discuss and work together on new ideas and concepts. Each workshop will be limited to 12 young booksellers for a more intense coaching experience.

There are 5 workshop topics:

1. E-book and bookstores
2. E-commerce and bookstores
3. Bookstore as a point of sale
4. New marketing concepts for bookstores
5. Image of the bookstore



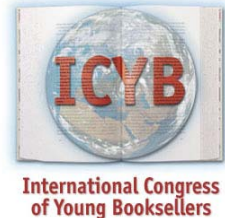
Each workshop will be conducted by a consultant of the COCD, the Flemish/Dutch knowledge centre for the development of creative thinking skills.

Conference results

- Participants will be expected to present 1-3 new concepts for each topic at the welcome dinner on June 16th of the European and International Booksellers Federations (EBF/IBF). - The same new concepts serve as input for the conference report.
- Participants are expected to translate concepts into an advice for (the management of) the participants' own bookstore.
- A full report will be made for the participants.

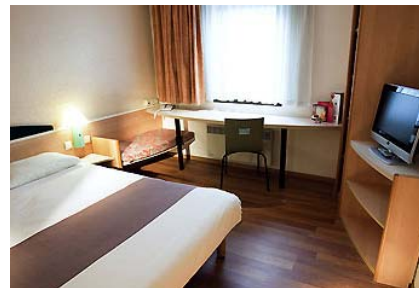

Please fill in the registration form and mail it before May 10th 2010.

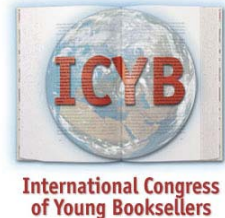

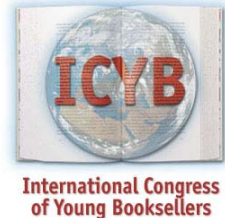

(*) Book dating

Book dating is a way to experience participants' skills of selling books. There are three rounds. 1/3 of the participants play in each round. Each person gets 3 minutes to promote his/her favourite book to 2 other persons. Everyone receives a list with all entries so that you can give a score for each book. The Top 3 of the Favourite Books of Young Booksellers will be presented at the dinner on Tuesday and at the EBF/IBF-dinner.
